




#### Gross annual income in 2010






### EU countries Gini coefficient of equivalized disposable income





#### Spanish debt as a percentage of GDP






#### Economic difficulties of Spanish households

- → Late payments on primary residence




#### Evolution of the Spanish middle class






### People at risk of poverty and social exclusion






### Why does the middle class matter? What prevents their welfare?
