Introduction

- Business environment and firms
 - Business environment as source of organizational contingencies for opportunities and threats (Ward et al. 1995)
 - Entrepreneurs' perception of the environment as a determinant for firms' success in the long term (Analoui and karami 2002)
 - Affects firms' location decision



Introduction

- Business environment and local government
 - Government officials being evaluated by local economic growth
 - Promoting the development of local industry
 - Attracting external investment





Research questions

- How can government improve firms' perception of the business environment?
- Whether interaction between government and industry improve perceived business environment?





Theoretical framework

- Government transparency
 - Transparency and political accountability (Piotrowski and Ryzin 2007)
 - Principal-agent model (Ferejohn 1999)
 - Increased transparency, lower uncertainty
 - Transparency and public trust (Alt 2002)





Theoretical framework

- Public participation
 - Participation and tolerance (Barber 1984; Warren 1992)
 - Public participation and political trust (Kettering Foundation 1991; Rowe and Frewer 2000)
 - Public participation and government responsiveness (Lauber and Knuth 1999)



Hypotheses

- Firms' perception of business environment could be improved by the level of public participation:
 - Level 1: Awareness of policy decisions
 - Level 2: Participation in policy making
 - Level 3: Government responsiveness





Data

- Lien foundation survey of businesses in China
 - -2011-2012
 - Telephone survey
 - Random selection
 - 2011 yellow book business directory
- 196 private firms in Shanghai

- How do you rate the city in the following aspects?
 - Enterprise registration and annual inspection
 - Taxation
 - Intellectual property protection
 - Access to loan
 - Logistics
 - Contract enforcement
 - Harmony among residents
 - Trust among businesses
 - Government support for business investment

Findings

- Effective communication with government has a positive impact on firms' perceived business environment.
 - Problem with successful participation (King et al 1998)
- The longer a firm stays in a city, the better perceived business environment.
